## 2023-24 Annual Report



**The Jacksonville Sports Medicine Program (JSMP)** is a non-profit advocacy and prevention program that is dedicated to youth sports safety through awareness, advocacy and prevention.



### Prevention

The Jacksonville Sports Medicine Program (JSMP) 's core mission is awareness, advocacy, and injury prevention. This mission energizes our passion for promoting high safety standards through our direct engagement with community sports medicine providers, school athletic programs, youth sports organizations, and healthcare institutions.

The vision of the JSMP extends our reach to state-wide stakeholders of youth sports programs, including the Florida High School Athletic Association, which considers the JSMP a top resource for high school sports safety standards. For nearly forty years, our program partners, anchored by Wolfson Children's Hospital, Nemours Children's Health, the Duval County Medical Society, Brooks Rehabilitation, and the Duval County Public Schools, have set the standard for keeping kids safe while playing sports.



### Education

Education is advocacy, in 2023 the JSMP, once again, surpassed expectations for continuing medical education for our area physicians and sports medicine providers. Multiple opportunities were provided for our medical community to learn more about best practices in sports safety and sports medicine care. Prevention standards for cardiac and heat related injury were key components to the 2023 First Coast Sports Injury Symposium hosted by the Jacksonville Jaguars medical staff and featured key presenters including Dr. Jon Drezner, team physician for the Seattle Seahawks who challenged our area providers on the many reasons to consider preparticipation ECG screenings for young athletes. Eric Coris, MD chair of the Florida High School Athletic Association's Sports Medicine Advisory Committee and a team physician for the Tampa Bay Buccaneers updated the audience on sports safety policies at the state level. More than







150 were in attendance and more than 1,000 education credits were issued for the event.

Our regions high-achieving high school students also got to participate in the 2023 Careers in Healthcare program that introduces high school students to healthcare career paths. More than 50 kids were in attendance to hear from a variety of healthcare professionals and speak with area college admissions professionals, college professors and representatives from the Jacksonville Fire and Rescue Department.

The Youth Sports Safety podcast produced by longtime Florida Hall of Fame, athletic trainer Jim Mackie, MS, LAT, ATC, continues to earn rave reviews. Over 35 podcast episodes were produced in 2023 on a



variety of sports safety topics. The podcast moves between provider related discussions and parent directed programming with the ultimate focus of keeping kids safe when competing in sports. Our most popular episodes in 2023 featured Steve Broglio, PhD, on the topic of sports concussion, Rob Huggins, PhD, and the topic of heat illness and performance as well as Stephanie Kuzdym and her research and reporting on safer sidelines. These and our entire library of episodes is available wherever you get your podcasts.



### **Awards**

In May 2023, Jaguars Head Coach Doug Pederson provided a highlight to the JSMP and Jaguars Prep North Florida High School Sports Safety Awards Gala and Fundraiser. Coach Pederson, his wife Jeannie and Jaguars General Manager Trent Baalke enjoyed spending time with our local high school athletic trainers, team physicians and school personnel as part of the gala celebration. The event hosted for the second year at the historic Ritz Theater in Jacksonville served to recognize our local sports medicine community and stakeholders of youth sports safety in our region.
